Sentence patterns can be understood as the way sentences are usually structured. It is important to learn the most common sentence patterns in English, as most of the sentences you will hear, write, and speak will follow these basic patterns. Sentence Patterns #1 - Noun / Verb The most basic sentence pattern is a noun followed by a verb.

Each component in the sentence serves an important function. There are eight parts of speech that are commonly used in constructing sensible sentences: nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, articles, conjunctions, pronouns, and prepositions.

A sentence pattern is how a sentence is structured using different parts of speech. There are about six different sentence patterns in English language known as the basic sentence patterns.

Sentence patterns just about all sentences in the English language fall into ten patterns determined by the presence and functions of nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs. The patterns are most easily classified according to the type of verb used: Verb of being patterns (1, 2, 3) use a form of the verb to be as the main verb in the sentence.

7 Basic Sentence Patterns in Teaching English - ESL ...

All the parts of speech in English are used to make sentences. All sentences include two parts: the subject and the verb (this is also known as the predicate). The subject is the person or thing that does something or that is described in the sentence. The verb is the action the person or thing takes or the description of the person or thing.

EXAMPLES OF SENTENCE PATTERN - Grammar in English

There are six basic or simple sentence patterns: Subject/Predicate, Action Verb. Subject/Predicate, Action Verb/Direct Object. Subject/Predicate, Action Verb/Adverb. Subject/Predicate, Linking Verb/Predicate Nominative. Subject/Predicate, Linking Verb/Predicate Adjective.

Basic English Sentence Patterns - Lexercise

Subject + verb. The simplest of sentence patterns is composed of a subject and verb without a direct object or subject complement. It uses an intransitive verb, that is, a verb requiring no direct object: Control rods remain inside the fuel assembly of the reactor.

Basic Patterns and Elements of the Sentence

You will notice that these basic sentence types can be expanded by dependent (subordinate) structures like dependent adverbial clauses, dependent relative clauses, and the variety of phrases made up of dependent prepositional, participial, appositive, and absolute phrases. These are all strategies of sentence expansion.

Expanding Sentences The examples above are basic sentences. Basic sentences can be expanded, or lengthened, by adding adjectives, adverbs and objects. 1. Subject-Verb: Jack eats. This is the basic subject-verb pattern. Jack quickly eats. An adverb is added (quickly) to tell how Jack eats. Jack quickly eats carrots.

Basic Sentence Structures in the English Language

There are five basic patterns around which most English sentences are built.* They are as follows: At the heart of every English sentence is the Subject-Verb relationship. Other elements can be added to make a sentence more interesting, but they are not essential to its formation.
