Lenin believed Stalin was a dangerous man. Lenin died in 1924. By 1928, Stalin was in total command of the Communist Party. Trotsky was forced into exile in 1929 and was no longer a threat. He was exiled to Mexico, where he was killed in 1940, probably on Stalin's orders.
