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### Guidelines For Writing Test Items

Test items. •Construct each item to assess a single written objective. •Make sure the item can be answered without looking at the options. •Avoid "tricky" and overly complex items. •Avoid textbook, verbatim phrasing. •Use proper grammar, punctuation, and spelling.

### Guidelines for Constructing Multiple-Choice Items

The amount of time required to complete an item should be consistent with the time allotment for items in the overall test design. As a general rule, a multiple-choice item on TIMSS 2015 is expected to require about 1 minute or less to complete, and constructed-response items are allocated 1-3 minutes.

The following guidelines are recommended for reviewing individual test items. When you review an item, write your comments on a copy of the item indicating your suggested changes. If you believe an item is not worth retaining, suggest it be deleted. 1.

1. Outline either a) the unit learning objectives or b) the unit content major concepts to be covered by the test. 2. Produce a test blueprint, plotting the outline from step 1 against some hierarchy representing levels of cognitive difficulty or depth of processing.

Every item should reflect specific content and a single specific mental behavior, as called for in test specifications (two-way grid, test blueprint). 2. Base each item on important content to learn; avoid trivial content.

### Guidelines for Test Design and Construction

Restricted Response- These essay questions limit what the student will discuss in the essay based on the wording of the question. For example, "State the main differences between John Adams'and Thomas Jefferson'sbeliefs about federalism," is a restricted response. What the student is to write about has been expressed to them within the question. Extended Response - These allow students to select what they wish to include in order to answer the question.

The negative word should be placed in the stem, not in the alternatives, and should be emphasized by using underlining, italics, bold face, or CAPITALS. In addition, each of the alternatives should be phrased positively to avoid forming a confusing double negative with the stem. Poor Example Better Example.
