In study 1, MNR analyses found a significant effect of frequency of occurrence on moral distress intensity for 31/51 situations for medical students (over 60% of cases: 9 patient safety and dignity, 2 consent, 18 student abuse, 2 'other' abuse).

Moral distress may be created when physical therapists' desire to provide optimal care conflicts with their organization's goals to remain financially viable or profitable. Moral distress has been associated with low perception of ethical environment, professional burnout, and high turnover in organizations.

A few years ago the liaisons group started studying literature indicating that moral distress is higher in settings where caregivers do not feel safe enough to raise ethical issues or speak up for patient safety. The literature suggested that taking action is a good way to mitigate moral distress and deepen ethical foundations of clinical practice.

Moral distress is an ethical problem that is a consequence of caring for people with health problems. It is recognized in healthcare professionals, in particular, nursing professionals in their nursing practice. Consequently, it is a significant nursing problem [22, 23].

Moral distress has subsequently been shown to be associated with burnout, which includes poor coping mechanisms such as moral disengagement, blunting, denial, and interpersonal conflict [3-7]. Moral distress as originally conceived by Jameton pertained to nurses and has been extensively studied in the nursing literature [8, 9].

7 Importantly, while Jameton's original definition limited moral distress to situations where nurses were unable to perform the actions that they knew were right, the expanded definition by these authors argues that moral agents can experience moral distress even when they think they acted in the best way possible given the circumstances, or when moral agents are unsure of what the best action is.
