Child Observation is the method of watching, listening, asking questions, documenting, and analyzing the observed words and actions of children as they interact with their surroundings and other people. Proper observation in childcare is crucial in helping educators and parents address the needs of early childhood development.

They can include drawings, dictated stories, attempts at writing words and numbers, and language samples, which are transcriptions of the exact words a child uses to express a thought or idea.

A child care observation form is a document that is used by most child care providers such as daycare centers and preschool institutions. The form contains the evaluations, assessments, and the analysis of the observer with regards to the child's behavior as well as the learning environment of the center.
