Edouard Vuillard - The Metropolitan Museum of Art

Although best known today for the small, intimate interiors he painted in the 1890s while affiliated with the group of artists known as the Nabis (prophets), Edouard Vuillard also produced a number of large decorative works, such as Place Vintimille, for both public buildings and private residences. It was painted for Marguerite Chapin--later the princess of Bassiano--an American expatriate living in Paris whom Vuillard first met in March 1910 through his friend Pierre Bonnard.

Known for the Intimist style of decorative painting pioneered with Bonnard, Vuillard frequently portrayed his friends and family in domestic settings, often placed amid myriad competing patterns. Abandoning perspective, Vuillard conveys depth through a clever placement of figures, employing the angular and abutting lines of the furniture in such a way as to denote their arrangement in the room.

Jean-Édouard Vuillard was a French painter, decorative artist and printmaker. From 1891 through 1900, he was a prominent member of the Nabis, making paintings which assembled areas of pure color, and interior scenes, influenced by Japanese prints, where the subjects were blended into colors and patterns. He also was a decorative artist, painting theater sets, panels for interior decoration, and designing plates and stained glass.

The two figures are in the apartment that Vuillard shared with his mother in Paris. Vuillard adopted a particularly steep angle of view in this painting, looking down upon the interaction of the figures. The viewer assumes the position of the artist himself, looking over his mother's shoulder as she lovingly feeds the baby.

1 This painting is one of nine canvases that Alexandre Natanson, director of La Revue blanche, commissioned from Vuillard in 1893 for his home in the Avenue du Bois de Boulogne. The decorative cycle, entitled Jardins publics (Public Gardens) was dismantled when the Natanson family moved to the Avenue des Champs-Élysées, where it was reinstalled in 1908.
